Introduction

Ireland's healthcare system is operating in an environment of increasing complexity, politicisation and resource constraint. Consultants are central to its performance where they lead clinical teams, shape services, influence governance decisions and advocate for patients and services. Yet many step into these responsibilities without formal leadership preparation, and often without the structural authority that their roles now demand.

The Consultant Executive Leadership Programme (CELP), delivered by Trinity Executive Education in partnership with the Irish Hospital Consultants Association, is designed to address this gap. CELP is not a generic leadership course but a consultant-specific executive development journey grounded in the real challenges Consultants face. It recognises the strong motivation among Consultants to contribute more meaningfully to service reform, policy development and system improvement, and aims to provide them with the skills to lead without formal authority while navigating organisational politics, influencing funding and policy decisions, and sustaining confidence in demanding environments.

The programme acknowledges that clinical expertise alone is no longer sufficient for effective system leadership. Consultants require the ability to communicate strategically, negotiate persuasively, build coalitions across disciplines and translate clinical insight into credible business cases and policy proposals. CELP equips participants with the frameworks, tools and confidence to operate at this level.

Delivered over three intensive modules across six months, the programme incorporates a dedicated residential component, intentionally designed to create the space and continuity necessary for deeper reflection, sustained peer exchange and meaningful integration of learning. Through this structured journey, CELP strengthens leadership identity, enhances influence capability and builds system literacy. Equally important, it establishes a trusted national peer network of Consultant leaders whose collaboration and support extend well beyond the formal programme.

CELP represents a strategic investment in Consultant leadership capability by the IHCA, positioning Consultants not only as clinical experts, but as credible system leaders who can shape reform, influence decision-making and drive meaningful, patient-centred change across Irish healthcare.

CELP at a Glance

Module 1: **Leading Self and Others in a Demanding System**

Themes explored:

Leadership identity, executive presence, crucial conversations, conflict management, teaming and psychological safety.

Participants explore the transition from expert clinician to system leader, developing clarity of purpose, authority without formal power, and practical tools for high-stakes conversations.

Module 2: **Leading Systems, Policy and Strategic Impact**

Themes explored:

Strategic foresight, understanding the Irish health system, influencing strategy and building business cases.

Participants strengthen system literacy, learn how decisions are formed across hospitals and policy environments, and translate clinical priorities into persuasive, credible proposals.

Module 3: **Leading Culture, Influence and Change**

Themes explored:

Negotiation, stakeholder engagement, organisational politics and leading culture shift.

Participants develop the confidence and skills to mobilise stakeholders, navigate resistance, and lead meaningful change under constraints.

An Executive Certificate in CELP from Trinity Executive Education, Trinity Business School, Trinity College Dublin, reflecting your commitment to leadership development at the highest standard.
